Sir/Madam,

- To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Karnataka Liberal Education University, Shri B.M. Kankanadi Ayurveda Mahavidyalaya,Shahapur, Belgaum- 590003, Karnataka (Inst. ID- AYU0052)**, inspection was conducted on **24.04.2025 & 25.04.2025 in hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM to process the permission with **100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 76 seats in 12 PG course subject namely (i) Dravyaguna Vigyana-05 seats, (ii) Rasa Shastra & Bhaisajya Kalpana- 11 seats, (iii) Agad Tantra avum Vidhi Vaidyaka-06 seats, (iv) Kaumarbhritya -Bala Roga -06 seats, (v) Panchakarma -06 seats, (vi) Shalya Tantra-06 seats, (vii) Shalakya Tantra-06 seats, (viii) Swasthavritta -06 seats, (ix) Rog Nidan avum Vikriti Vigyan - 06 seats & (x) Prasuti & Stri Roga-06 seats (xi) Kayachikitsa - 06 seats, (xii) Kayachikitsa-Rasayan & Vajikaran -06 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.**
- Further, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely the Minimum essential standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals Regulations, 2024", and "Minimum essential standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Post Graduate Education in Ayurveda" Regulations, 2024, provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations there under.
- Furthermore, the Board had issued two letters to the college vide ref no. 3/2025/MARB/General Matters Dated 05.05.2025 and vide ref no. 3/2025/MARB/General Matters Dated 10.06.2025 with regard to bifurcation of Shalakya PG program into Shalakya-NetraRogaChikitsa (Ayurveda Opthamology) & Shalakya-Karna, Naasa and MukhaRogaChikitsa (Ayurveda Oto-Rhino-Larngology)as per sub regulation no. 3 of the Regulation 04 of MESA&R PG Ayurveda Regulation 2024, respectively to which the college had submitted their compliance.
- Accordingly, the assessment report was duly placed before the **140th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) convened on 13.08.2025** and Board observed that the college is not fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission as per the concerned acts and regulations, but is fulfilling the criteria in accordance with the Board's policy letters issued on 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025 in 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 13 PG courses. Further, the Board also observed that the college is meeting the notified & requisite criteria for the issuance of the Extended Permission for 100 seats in UG as per regulation 54 (2) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024 and 12 PG courses Regulation 15(5) of NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations 2024 as the college has been permitted for last three consecutive years. Accordingly, the Board decided as follows:
 - To issue Extended permission in UG BAMS course with intake capacity of 100 seats as per regulation 54(2) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024.

- b) To issue Extended Permission in 13 PG Courses as per regulation 15(5) of NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulation, 2024.

5. Accordingly, the decision was communicated to you vide letter of even no. dated 14.08.2025. However, the bifurcation of Shalakya PG courses was not incorporated with Extended Permission. Hence, revised permission letter is hereby being issued after including the bifurcation of Shalakya PG program into Shalakya-NetraRogaChikitsa (Ayurveda Ophthalmology) & Shalakya-Karna, Naasa and MukhaRogaChikitsa (Ayurveda Oto-Rhino-Larngology) as per sub regulation no. 3 of the Regulation 04 of MESA&R PG Ayurveda Regulation 2024.

"DECISION"

6. Therefore, Karnataka Liberal Education University, Shri B.M. Kankanadi Ayurveda Mahavidyalaya, Shahapur, Belgaum- 590003, Karnataka (Inst. ID- AYU0052) is hereby granted with:-

- a) To issue Extended permission in UG BAMS course with intake capacity of 100 seats as per regulation 54(2) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024.
- b) To issue Extended Permission in 13 PG Courses (i) Dravyaguna Vigyana-05 seats, (ii) Rasa Shastra & Bhaisajya Kalpana- 11 seats, (iii) Agad Tantra avum Vidhi Vaidyaka-06 seats, (iv) Kaumarbhritya -Bala Roga -06 seats, (v) Panchakarma -06 seats, (vi) Shalya Tantra-06 seats, (vii) Shalakya-Netra Roga Chikitsa (Ayurveda Ophthalmology) - 03 seats, (viii) Shalakya-Karna, Naasa and Mukha Roga Chikitsa (Ayurveda Oto-Rhino-Larngology) - 03 seats, (ix) Swasthavritta -06 seats, (x) Rog Nidan avum Vikriti Vigyan - 06 seats & (xi) Prasuti & Stri Roga-06 seats (xii) Kayachikitsa -06 seats, (xiii) Kayachikitsa-Rasayan & Vajikaran -06 seats as per regulation 15(5) of NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulation, 2024.

The aforementioned decision is issued under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that following requirements shall be fulfilled:-

- I. It is informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 100 seats in UG Course and 15% of postgraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 76 seats in 13 PG Course shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
- II. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
7. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
8. Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
9. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
10. **You are hereby instructed to comply with all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the Implementation letters vide. ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS. Dated 09.05.2024 & 06.09.2024 issued by the Board.**
11. **The following requirements must be fulfilled and the compliance report must reach the Board by 31st December, 2025 to be considered for the issuance of permission for the academic session 2026-2027:-**
- All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
 - All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - All the requirement of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standard of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2022.
 - All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations, 2024.

12. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine.
